School Crossing

As a mum of a six-year-old attending Langford School and a two-year-old who will be attending, I am very concerned about the issue of safety on Peregrine Way. At 8.45 am and 3.15 pm it is extremely busy, with parked cars restricting your view and lots of traffic on an otherwise quiet road. We often have to wait some time to cross the road, as the traffic rarely makes allowances, in terms of speed, for the fact that they are passing a school and there are lots of young children about.

Some older children walk to school unaccompanied and the number of parked cars often obscure their vision. The single and double-decker busses also pass at these times, and do not slow down very much.

I believe we need to address this issue as a matter of urgency, and I would like to see either a pedestrian crossing or speed ramp to make drivers more cautious of school children crossing. Also, reinforcement of parking restrictions would be useful.




