

Serves 2

Ingredients:

- 6 Slices white or brown bread
- 4 tbsp mayonnaise
- 2 tbsp Dijon mustard
- 3 tomatoes, thinly sliced
- 6 streaky bacon rashers
- $125g (4^{1}/_{2} oz)$ thinly sliced cooked chicken
- Handful of mixed salad leaves

Procedure:

Grill the bacon until crisp.
