The hay cut has removed the array of wildflowers and grasses, and the aftermath sheep grazing will follow. The broad hedgerows are still sheltering a host of birds and insects, and are beginning to colour as berries ripen.

These meet on Tuesdays 9:30am - 4pm, with the next ones 12 & 26 August and 9 & 23 September, then weekly from October.
