

Environment Committee Report

"It is not a question of what the Environment can do for us, but what we can do for the environment." (with apologies to JFK)

Having just taken over the Chairmanship of the LVCA Environment Committee, I thought it a good time to say something about the work we do. As our title suggests, we are concerned with the Village environment - the lake, litter, the footpaths and cycle-ways, and facilities we think that Langford Village needs. In the past we have complained about the upkeep of the shrubbery and grass verges; we have campaigned to have some of the footpaths resurfaced and the barriers widened for the sake of wheel-chairs and buggies; we have asked for more litter bins, more telephone kiosks and our own post office. Sometimes we have been successful, but at other times we have failed to acquire what we think the people in Langford Village should have. Nevertheless, we shall continue striving to improve our environment. If you know of any problem that falls into our area of concern, please let me know. We promise to consider it and, if we feel it to be something that we could pursue with some measure of success, then we will. Of course, if anyone would like to join the Committee, they would be most welcome.

However, not all the problems we identify are the responsibility of Oxfordshire County Council, Cherwell District Council or Bicester Town Council. There is an on-going problem of litter and dogfouling (despite the threat of a heavy fine). Dogfouling is a particular problem on the grass around Jubilee Lake where the children stand to feed the ducks. This is both unpleasant and unhygienic. The Council provides bins for both of these problems; it is up to us and our children to use them.

We have a very pleasant place in which to live, but it could be better. Help us to make it so.

What is the Internet - OKAY, The "NET"

What is the Internet, what can it to do for ME and how can I join in the action?

These are some of the questions that are quite often asked.

What is the Internet?

The word Internet came about by two words, International and Network. This, in its simplest terms describes the Internet as an International Network of computers. It is also referred to as the 'World-Wide-Web'.

The Internet was originally designed for the US military, some 30 years ago, as a way of transporting information around the world at the speed of light. In the event of war, because of the unique way the Internet works, if part of this network collapses, the information will still get to its destination via an alternative route.

So what can the Internet do for me?

One of the many ways that the Internet can help you is through the use of Email, whether it is for business or personal use. Keep in touch with friends, family or colleagues around the world or just around the corner, all for the cost of a local call. You are in control, so you can send your messages anytime of the day or night, to fit in with your busy lifestyle.

To send a message via Email, you are charged for a local 0845 call as opposed to an International Call to your family in Australia.

Email Explained!

Just as the fax machine became an invaluable communication medium for business, so too is Email. There has always been a problem with the quality of fax messages being received and also a major cost element in the transportation of each page.

- A single A4 document can take minutes to be sent by a fax machine as well as the high telephone charges.
- A similar document can be sent by Email in a matter of seconds and can be viewed ANYWHERE around the world. This document can also be edited, sent back to its originator, or even forwarded on.

To be able to send and receive email, you will need a personal computer, a modem and a 'Dial-Up' account with an Internet Service Provider (ISP). Your ISP will issue you with a unique Email address, which you can send and receive emails from. Your email address will be split into 2 parts. i.e. yourname @ magic-carpet.co.uk

yourname being your own choice of name if available

@ Denotes it is an email address and is pronounced

'ot'

magic-carpet.co.uk is the name of your ISP.
What do I need and how do I 'Surf the Web'?
What is POP3 Email?


