Continued with the upkeep and management of the Langford Village Hall.


Maintained the LVCA financial accounts and arranged for the accounts to be independently audited.

Worked with the Bicester Community Association sharing ideas with other Community Groups in the Bicester area.


Maintained the Langford Village website. www.langfordlife.org.uk

## Message from the Chairman of the General Committee

As Chairman of the LVCA I would like to update you on a few of the many things which make Langford Village such a vibrant place to live. This year, we have again been lucky to have a group of committed volunteers who have kept the hall going and the Langford Life magazine active.

We see our main responsibility being the upkeep and the management of the hall, a fine facility used extensively by the community. To give you an idea of its usage, in any one week there are typically 15 regular groups and societies comprising over 300 people.

Of course, running all this, keeping the hall clean and well maintained, and organising opening and closing rotas, especially for the casual bookings, is a logistical nightmare. I really don¹t know how we would function without two ladies; the everfaithful Kirsty Coombes, who is Hall Manager, and more recently, Michelle Roe, who is Chair of Hall Committee and Hall Bookings Manager.

Another big thank you this year must go to Maggie Kavanagh, who took over as Treasurer at short notice last year. And whilst Maggie was only able to be with us for nine months due to professional studies, she has helped re-organise the finances. Maggie also provided a smooth handover to our new Treasurer, Roger Winson, also playing a large part in encouraging him to see that this was a role he could not live without! Thank you Maggie.

We have been pleased with increased links with the very active Friends of Langford Village School who used the hall for an excellent barn dance. We look forward to closer links with them over the coming months. Matt Fincham also arranged a Great British Tea Break fund raising afternoon for the Lymphoma Charity, raising £309.20 in the process.

With the closing of the 200 Club, funds of £688 were distributed, with half going to Langford Village School for playground equipment, the remainder being distributed between the non-profit making hall user groups.

Involvement with the Community Payback programme has been another highlight. This was almost exclusively arranged by Michelle Roe, and has seen various jobs carried out, including cleaning all the chairs, freshening up the hall and work in the garden. They even assisted with the litter-pick morning.

We also continue to work with the Bicester Communities Association, sharing ideas with other community groups in the area, and we are grateful for Pauline McCreadie in organising this.
