Matters Arising:	
Annual Security system service completed

Treasurer's Update:	
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The accounts are now ready to be submitted for independent review.	
<ul> <li>For y/e 31st March 2022 we will declare an overall deficit of £(8,643), comprising a normal operating surplus of £5,710 and a Hall Improvements deficit of £(14,354).</li> </ul>	
The overall figures are £360 better than forecast in February.	
• During the last year we spent £28.6k on improvements to the hall, which was funded by grants of £14.2k, plus this year's operating surplus of £5.7k, and £8.7k from our existing reserves.	
Balance is £38k in various bank accounts, this will reduce by £8k due to accruals and pre-payments.	
Budgeting plans have been made for increases in utility bills.	
Hall Bookings:	
Regarding regular hall bookings, we are losing Home-Start on a Monday afternoon, there is interest from the National Diabetes Prevention Programme, yet to be confirmed.	
The Hall is fully booked for June and most of May.	

#### Hall Maintenance:

The caretaking duties for the Hall were taken on by Simon Thompson from 1st April 2022. Simon has taken over all maintenance contracts. Simon has access to Hive control via the app and will take over responsibility for heating programming from 1st May. Chris has produced a handover guide, which will also be in the maintenance folder, and Chris will also shadow Simon whilst he familiarises himself with the role. Responsibility for key inventory and stock of keys remains with Chris for the time being and all Committee members to please confirm exactly what keys they're currently holding so that this detail can also be transferred to Simon soon. The key for opening windows was removed from the cupboard by a person unknown. A replacement was put in place.

## Communication and Marketing:

A further 5-star Google review received in praise of the Hall and the booking process.

Various articles posted this month, including news of the promised bus shelters for Langford, election candidates, cold callers alert and images of the successful Yoga Charity Event run by Zara.

On Facebook, Langford Life has just broken through the 700 likes/followers' level. doubling the number of residents who like/follow Langford Life since the start of 2019.

Sing and Sign, Peekaboo and the Community Orchard (Earth Day event) all posted news of their events with us on Facebook this month.
