Treasurer's Update:	
Our year-to-date Normal Operating Surplus increased from £1.3k to £1.6k which is £1.1k better than budget. The main reason was lower than budgeted spend on Hall Maintenance.	
The £1.0k cost of painting the rear fence was funded from the Hall Improvement Budget, and it is forecast that we will spend up to the budget of £10.0k by the end of the year.	
Hall Bookings:	
We've accepted a 6 week booking for an Adult Ballet class during the school holidays, run by a former pupil of Victoria Hill.	

We also have a new regular booking from a charity called Sport in Mind. This is for Yoga for Mental Wellbeing for people with mental health issues, Elaine has agreed that this will not interfere with her business. We have offered the first 8 weeks free, funded by the CDC grants awarded by Paul Tysoe, and they are due to start on Wednesday 22nd June.

Hallmaster have issued an update meaning that casual users can optionally book as a guest rather than create an account.

Communication and Marketing:

Sandra and Carole attended Fltr on Monday 13th, two sessions of 'Are you new to Langford' both were well attended. It was lovely to meet so many people, and a chance to tell them about LVCA, the hall and locality issues. It has resulted in 3 people expressing a desire to be involved with LVCA.

Posts during this month on web/socials have included: the arrival of bus shelters on Langford, the reopening of Bicester Road bridge to Launton, Victoria's ballet classes, Welcome to Langford sessions, No-Mow May, latest EWR newsletter, new Yoga sessions, summer hall availability and a new local image to mark the Platinum Jubilee.

Hall Improvements:

4 large size tables ordered delivery due on 22nd June.

Met Lee from LKT at hall, 15th, quoting for replacing remaining ceiling lights to LED, also replacing main halls sockets, along entrance lobby, including the light switch in the entrance lobby which is not working. The total cost is to £1584. - all agreed

Signage at hall delayed due to an error in wording, now being fitted Friday 24th June. Waterman Graphics are supplying a "No public toilets" sign.

Contacted Andy Ng regarding Nightingale Place, the hole appearing in the parking space immediately in front of the hall. Columns should now be painted dark grey to match the lights.

ACRE contacted all halls about possible funding via the government and we could express an interest. Proposed project, selected the disabled toilet.

John Broad, informed the committee via Launton Parish Council meeting, the East West Rail hub is being dismantled and there may be a possibility of some equipment, FOC plus there is some money being allocated to the local area. Waiting to hear the contact's details from John.

Paul Tysoe, our Community Development Manager at CDC informed us there is an opportunity from a fund FCC Community Action Fund, Chairperson is looking at with a view to a larger grant for updating the toilets or kitchen
